


Role of SMEs (Small and Medium Sized Enterprises) in the Transport Infrastructure Development

- The expansion of SMEs in current years promotes the need to develop transport infrastructure by urging investment from Government and private sector.
- SMEs participate in infrastructure projects, indirectly in large –scale projects by subcontracting or providing specialized services ; or directly in small – scale projects.
- SMEs help highlight the transport infrastructure development in rural areas.
- In Vietnam, private sector is expected to step up and make their contribution under Public Private Partnership (PPP) scheme.





SMEs in procurement and implementation stage:

 If project is awarded to non-SME
 -> Private partner has to subcontract at least 20% to SMEs Promote SMEs in Public Procurement => SMEs can participate in selection processes

SME's contribution: 33% of State Revenue 62% of jobs




Figure 2.1 SMEs and Large Enterprises in Vietnam between 2004 and 2013

BUT


- Still have opportunities in small contracts and sub-contracts
